You must have a **minimum of four course prefixes** (AGEC) from different departments. Equivalent transfer classes will satisfy the K-State 8 requirements. The courses listed are some of the most common ways for you to meet the requirements.

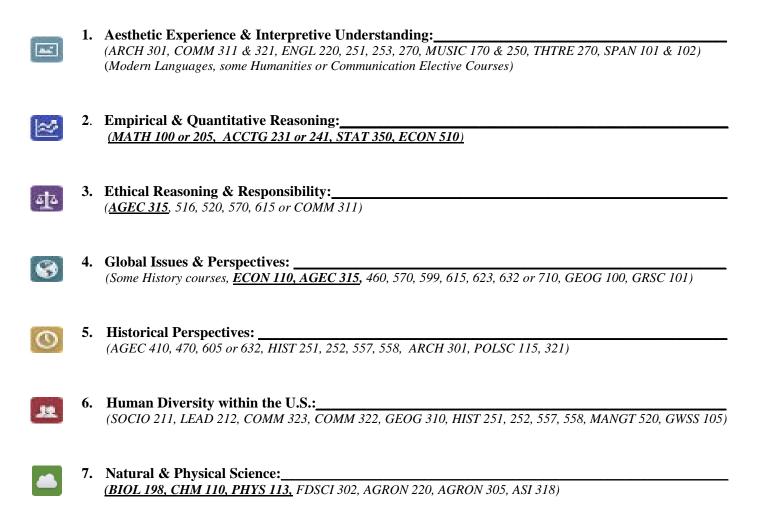
